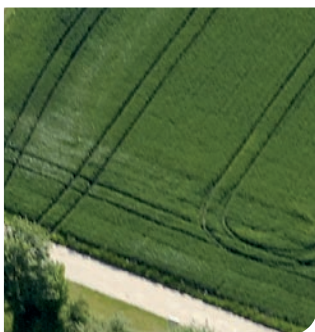
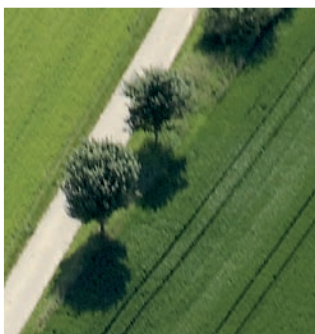

in Argentina, Brazil, the U.S.A., Indonesia and other countries and exporting them into the European Union. The Directive sets up hurdles exposing the complete chain, from biomass production to the end processor, under pressure of optimization by making constantly more stringent requirements on the reduction of greenhouse gases. Does this mean that certain fuels or biofuels will have no chance of survival? The debate about ILUC is followed closely by the biofuels community around the world. What proposals will the EU Commission make and what implications will they have?

Germany transformed the Directive into national law by January 1, 2011. The agricultural trading firms as primary distributors of biomass and also the processors along the chain have been certified according to the requirement criteria of the ISCC or REDcert certification systems. This was an extraordinary challenge in view of the large number of firms, especially on the level of agriculture and agricultural trade. The other member states are still confronted with this task, which must be complied with starting in 2012 lest penalties are faced.

On this background, the EU Commission has approved further certification systems.

This makes sustainability and its implementation in accord with fair international competition in raw materials and trade one of the central topics at this 9th International Biofuels Congress. Participants will discuss specific biofuels related topics in forums. These include not only the present and future market situations but also engine matters – access to the market is not possible without release and raising consumer awareness. UFOP can look back on 20 years experience in launching biodiesel in the market.

Considering the topicality of the challenges described, the Congress is once again an ideal platform for discussing the rules set up by Germany and also the expected regulatory framework on the European level and in other countries. This year's Specialist Congress offers representatives of the affected associations, companies and also from politics the ideal platform on which to encourage the exchange of information and experience.

This leads me to invite you cordially to attend our Specialist Congress this year.

The requirements affect not only companies within the European Union but also businesses producing biofuels from raw materials

- Has politics given up the targets fixed in the coalition treaty (e.g., that of reviving the pure biofuels market) or can concrete activities still be expected in the remaining short period of time?
- Do the present targets and projects provide a reliable basis for future plans of the biofuels sector?
- Will the quota system be replaced by GHG based regulations in the foreseeable future?
- Why does politics not really respond to the German pioneering role in the sustainable production of biofuels?
- What consequences emerge for the government from the current discussion about ILUC?
- When will the fuels strategy which the government has been preparing for some time be presented and discussed in public?
- How does the government view the further development of the „second generation fuels“, and what approaches should be encouraged in the government's view?

A revised Renewable Energies Act has been adopted in the electricity sector. Politicians generally agree that the heat sector is in urgent need of redevelopment. Appropriate measures are being discussed between the government and the states. But, apart from the definition of medium and long-term objectives as far as the share of renewable energies is concerned, do the factions in the Bundestag Parliament have visions of how mobility should be organized in the future? This Congress should send strong and clear signals for this to the government and the Parliament.

In addition to this, the ambitious Congress program gives reason to hope that additional information and proposals from science, industry and the practical activities in the vegetable oil, bioethanol and biodiesel sectors will make a contribution to strengthening and supporting the entire biofuels market. And, of course, as in the past, participants and visitors will exchange opinion and experience, especially also during the social gathering in the evening of the first Congress day at the „nature.tec – exhibition for bioenergy and primary raw materials“ at the Green Week.

I am looking forward to informative and also convivial days and to seeing you again.
